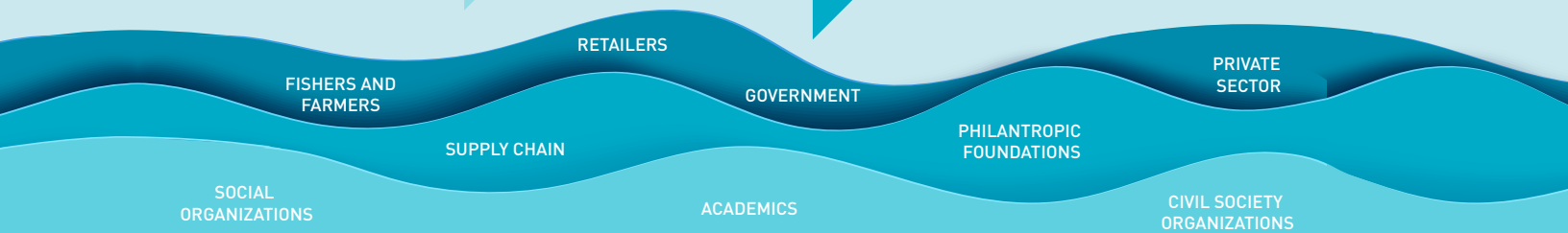
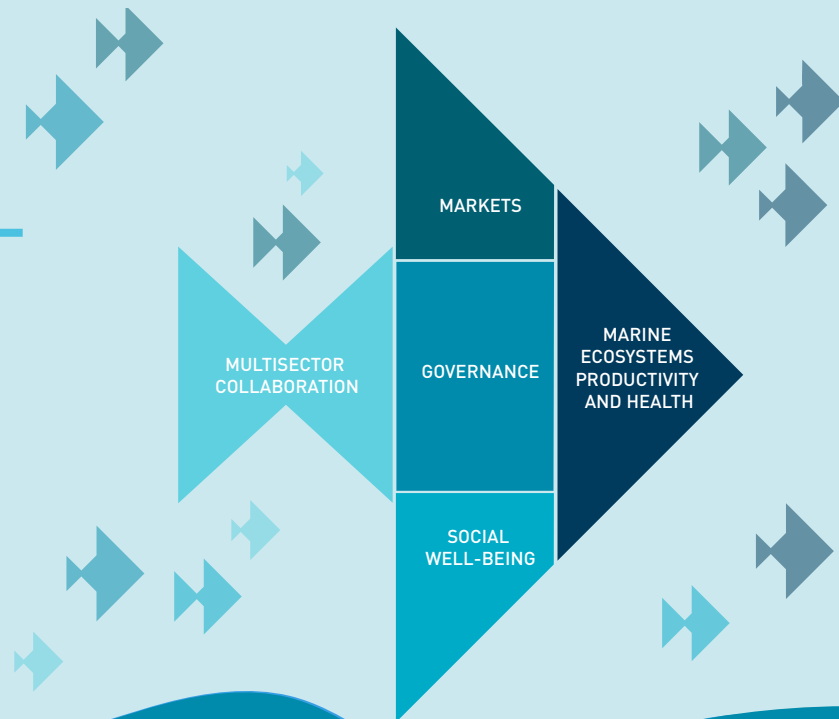
The Initiative is composed of a group of diverse stakeholders— fishers, farmers, retailers, exporters, local community members, government officials, and civil society organizations. As such, we value the contribution of industrial and small-scale fishing and aquaculture to the Mexican economy, regional

development, prosperity of fishing communities, and to the country's food security. Our work is focused on ensuring that these activities are carried out without detriment to the health and productivity of the ocean and inland waters and work to shift the dominant paradigm from confrontation between the sectors to multisector collaboration.

At ICPMX we have a common agenda that establishes the vision of change that we seek together, a common understanding of the problem and five components that we address through actions at the individual and collective level.



The five components that we agreed to work within our common agenda are the following:



How do we advance these components?

1. Through dialogue and collaboration among the different sectors involved in fisheries and aquaculture.
2. By implementing mutually reinforcing activities among participants.
3. Through ensuring continuous communication between participants and other key actors.
4. With support from the backbone team who is responsible for organizing and facilitating the communication and collaboration between members of the initiative.
5. By having a learning plan and developing a shared measurement system.
